Safeguarding Do's and Don'ts

This advice is aimed specifically at outreach work or any activity in schools or environments where you will be interacting with children and under-18s.

All schools will have a designated safeguarding lead and process. Ask who this is, and be aware of and respect the school's own regulations and advice regarding safeguarding.

 Find out who the Senior Designated Officer is Maintain boundaries Declare any gifts you are offered/receive Ensure that selection processes are fair Be aware that contact may be misconstrued Consider how contact is made Be prepared to explain your actions Be sensitive to culture, religion, gender Consider Health and Safety Regulations Consider what is appropriate Avoid, wherever possible, one to one situations involving pupils Avoid remote and secluded areas Avoid "engaged" signs Avoid physical contact when children are in a state of undress Avoid visually intrusive behaviour Announce intention if entering a changing room Dress safely and appropriately for the tasks that you are required to undertake Treat all persons with respect and dignity 	 Adults must not have sexual relationships with pupils Adults must not communicate with pupils in ways that could be interpreted as sexually suggestive or provocative Adults must not make sexual remarks to pupils Adults must not discuss their own sexual relationships with pupils Do not disclose personal contact details Do not access Social Networking Sites with pupils Do not use force as punishment Do not assume that all children seek physical comfort if they are distressed Never touch a child in a way that might be considered indecent Do not give gifts or rewards as an individual Do not change in the same place as pupils Do not use mobile phones to take pictures Do not take pictures in secret
