2. Chair Introductions

The Chair gave an introduction all attendees present at the Council.

3. Announcements & Co-options

No announcements were made.

4. Minutes from last meeting

TC mentions that under the last policy review, the Chair of the Education Committee and the Chair of the Environment Committee abstained when there was a vote regarding tuition fees.

TC asks the present members if they have anything to raise regarding the previous minutes.

Vote undertaken to approve the minutes from previous meeting.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 19 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 20 ABSENTIONS

5. Electing a temporary Chair for the meeting

JV mentions two serious conflict of interest cases on the Council.

JV wants to ask SC about their interpretation of by-law 36 conflict of interest policy and whether it applies to student trustees holding multiple SU positions.

SC says that their view is that there is a massive conflict of interest.

JV says that there is a conflict of interest which has not been dealt with and that he would therefore like to move for a Vote of No Confidence in the Chair.

AT replies saying that they are in a period of change in the by-laws, with the Regeneration Project securing and outlining changes in democratic processes which will affect the by-laws. AT is conscious that the appointment of both members to the Trustee Board and their elections to their current roles have happened proceeding this but says that she cannot speak to whether this constitutes a conflict of interest or

AT says it is worth noting several people hold both a Trustee and Student Council

AT says if changes are to be implemented, it would be affecting an election to a position.

SC says a decision should be made now and that a vote should be taken, or in the next Council meeting.

AT says it is worth having the by-law changes approved before any decisions are made based on the by-law changes.

JV says he would like to push for Motion 1, No Confidence in the Chair, and Motion 7, to vote immediately.

YY says that two procedural motions were put forward at once by JV and that one should be addressed first, followed by a discussion of the other. JV wants to discuss Motion 1 first.

MPI wants to ask JV if the by-laws mention the mandate point that JV raised regarding the size of the mandate and if this point is inconsistent with the by-laws.

TC agrees with JV that it has nothing to do with representing students and points out they they're not talking about the FTOs having a conflict of interest, which makes him feel targeted.

GL agrees with JV, questioning how the interest of SU be represented, alongside its finances as an institution, whilst also representing the democratic mandate of students.

GL points out that TFOs are employees of the SU, and so they represent it, whereas TC is volunteering for both.

Louis questions why the proposed by-law changes are being taken into consideration now and questions why it is an issue if they're not explicitly depicted by the current process of by-laws.

MPI builds on GL's point that TC doesn't sit on impact assessment whilst the whole board can overall those decisions.

OO notes that nobody suggested TC is incapable of fulfilling the role of Chair or Trustee, but him being in both positions and being able to influence the duty of Chair doesn't rule out the existence of the conflict of interest.

Vote undertaken for whether there should be No Confidence in the Chair.

MAJORITY APPROVED 27 IN FAVOUR / 12 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

TC asks for someone to enforce Procedural Motion 2.

YY says a temporary Chair will be elected and that TC still exists as a voting member of Council, but not as Chair.

Vote undertaken for the nomination of GL to be the temporary Chair for the Council.

MAJORITY APPROVED 31 IN FAVOUR / 2 AGAINST / 6 ABSENTIONS

6. Motions to Student Council/All Students Vote

6.1 The representative roles in societies and sports elections (Council)

Proposer: Josh Bradbury Seconder: Ben Althen

BA says the motion should be put forward as it enables the representation of all students and prevents abuse of certain powers and misuse of democratic processes against Union values.

However, BA doesn't believe that Council should vote on the motion at this time, as it hasn't been scrutinised by the elected representatives of the student body.

BA suggests postponing voting on this motion until the next Council meeting to allow Societies Forum and Sports Forum to scrutinise and suggest changes to it.

MPI seconds BA's point.

Vote undertaken to delay the motion.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 22 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 3 ABSENTIONS

AT says this motion was looked at last week and it had a post-amendment. AT asks if this is the version that will go to Sports Forum and Societies Forum for consultation, or will it have to come up to Council.

YY replies saying because the amendments were sent over recently, the proposal was yet to look at those, but they can send it through to the proposal to prompt a discussion about whether they want to accept it and include it as part of the motion or add it to the subsequent council meeting.

6.2 Getting Asylum Seeker Students, the Right to Work (ASV)

Proposer: Eloise Bui Seconder: Bel Govier BG wants to start a student action whereby the Warwick SU would join the 'lift the ban' campaign, which is trying to asylum seekers in the UK the right to work.

BG speaks of the high poverty rates amongst asylum seekers and says this is important to Warwick because it is a sanctuary university which gives out scholarships to asylum seekers.

BG says they are at a disadvantage compared to other international students as they aren't able to gain work experience, but all students should have equal rights.

GL says this will be going to ASV and so it doesn't have to be voted on in Council.

6.3 Warwick SU to reaffiliate to NUS to restore our national voice (ASV)

Proposer: Fraser Amos Seconder: Gabriel Hvams

GH says the NUS needs to represent Warwick students on a national scale. GH says there was a very low turnout and a high abstention rate in the prior vote earlier this year when a motion was passed to disaffiliate from the NUS. GH contests that this should be reconsidered. GH says the campaign was mainly run by the Warwick Conservative Association, which has a lot of antisemitism and used it as a political tool. GH says the Warwick SU should stand against this by being affiliated to the NUS.

GL calls the floor for any further questions in relation to this motion.

BS says she seconds everything GH said. BS mentions that none of the Jewish Society executives or any other body representing Jewish students were consulted, and so the grounds of solidarity that the previous motion stood on were fully illegitimate.

6.4 Let's fight for better on-campus accommodation (ASV)

Proposer: Monty Rumbold Seconder: Nye Steele

Motion proposer MR says the state of on-campus accommodation is declining whilst rents are rising. MR says Whitefields, the only accommodation deemed affordable by the NUS, makes up less than 1% of the rooms on campus and is scheduled to be demolished. MR says the Warwick SU should support the aims of the Warwick Housing Organisation to campaign for rent reductions, rent freezes, and more accessible accommodation.

A point was made that the version of the motion displayed is not the revised version. The last point on the motion should be rephrased so that rents are firstly brought back down to pre-COVID levels and then frozen.

YY says if MR and NS are happy for the amendments to be made, then a vote won't be conducted before it goes to ASV, but if they aren't happy with it, a discussion can be had.

MR and NS are happy for the revised version of the motion to go through.

GL calls the floor for if anyone would like to speak against the motion. Nobody speaks against it.

6.5 Plant-Based Warwick to tackle the climate crisis: for a just transition (ASV)

Proposer: Vivek Venkatram Seconder: James Clark

The motion proposer and seconder aren't present. WS speaks on behalf of the motion, saying that due to the climate crisis, the Warwick SU should support the plant-based universities campaign.

SC says it's important to locally source the university's food as much as possible.

Matt raises an issue with the point in the motion stating that 100% of food and drink options in SU outlets should be plant-based by 2027, since not all students may want this diet. Matt proposes amend the motion and then vote on it.

SC claims that this motion doesn't prevent choice for students, as other outlets off campus would still be available. It isn't about stopping individual preference to eat meat, but rather making it less available to contribute to emissions.

BT suggests amending the motion to mention that plant-based food should be sourced locally.

VR says it would potentially increase options for people who have allergies.

LG says there's a risk of backlash, since many students on campus eat meat, and by the time the motion comes into effect, it will be impacting students who aren't at the university yet and weren't able to vote on the motion.

VR says that other universities have successfully implemented this motion and that it is approved at Council, it will only pass if the students vote for it at ASV.

6.6 Warwick SU to boost student voter turnout (ASV)

Proposer: Ollie Chapman Seconder: James Martin

OC says that the SU should take action to encourage students to vote.

GL calls the floor for speakers in favour or against the motion. Nobody speaks.

GL says that this motion will go to ASV.

6.7 End the Sale of Tobacco and Vaping Products in SU locations (Removed)

Proposer: James Kimmins Seconder: Matthew Plank

GL says this motion has already been turned down and doesn't need discussion.

YY confirms that there are no outlets in the SU for student vaping or tobacco.

6.8 Bring back RON, quoracy, joint-running for PTO roles and less restrictive campaigning regulations – lets improve accessibility and opportunity for scrutiny in **Union Elections (Council)**

Proposer: James Varney Seconder: Maximilian Pike

JV and MPI propose making changes to the election process by making the workload more manageable for part-time officers, bringing back RON to all Union elections and removing the restrictive regulations in place for campaigns.

DV seconds this motion.

Vote undertaken.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 36 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

6.9 Warwick US to make the Gender Expression Fund permanent (Decision made)

Proposer: Dorian Valentine Seconder: Adrian Cerny

YY says that the decision was taken through to assessment and through discussion with the motion proposer, it will be adopted and acted upon.

6.10 Warwick stands in solidarity with Professor Hakim Adi and the campaign to Save the MRes in the History of Africa and the African Diaspora (Emergency Motion)

AT mentions that none of the emergency motions have had the opportunity for student input and suggests preliminarily approving them at Council so that they can be held under scrutiny before moving to ASV.

EN asks whether amendments or proposals can be made in the Council meeting or if they have to be sent direct to the forums.

GL says that since the forums haven't had the chance to meet yet, the emergency motions can be discussed at the Council, with the proposals being passed on to the motion seconders.

JC wants to clarify the position of the motion proposers and seconders in accepting or rejecting proposed amendments, asking whether within the forum there needs to be at least a 50% vote in favour of the suggested amendments from the proposers and seconders.

YY says that the forum needs to accept the amendment collectively as an amendment that they want to put forward to ASV. If they don't accept it, the Council must discuss the next steps forward.

SC speaks in favour of the motion, saying that Hakim Adi was arbitrarily removed from his position.

A point was made that the course Adi taught was the only course of its kind in Europe, the students studying it are left without a supervisor, and Adi has lost his job. We need to show support to set a precedent for other societies.

AT suggests that it might be worth sending to academic forum and it might be worth completing the forum by circulation so that there's a chance for anyone who didn't attend see the motion as well.

A point was made that it should go to academic forum because it would be the education officer who would be able to take the issue to the university.

Vote undertaken for taking the motion to Liberation and Diversity Forum and academic Forum.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 36 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

YY opens a discussion about what will happen if the motion proposer or seconder don't want to accept the amendment.

Vote undertaken for implementing SC's proposition.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 19 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

YY notes that any amendments that get circulated through to the forums needs to be agreed upon by at least 50% of the forums.

6.11 Motion for 30-member exemption: Sports (Emergency Motion)

LG says that Sports Forum should be able to give exemptions from the 30-member requirement to sports clubs. Societies Forum is already able to do this and so it would merely be an extension of this ability. Sports requires a lot of infrastructure. with links to governing bodies, both local and national, as well as a lot of investment, which can't be gained within a year.

YY clarifies that this could be a by-law change and an emergency motion.

LG notes that this motion hasn't received formal minuted approval, however it has been discussed at length within and been approved by the Sports Forum.

Vote undertaken.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 19 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS The motion is now an SU by-law.

6.12 Warwick SU to support Muslim, Arab and Palestinian students in face of Islamophobic and racist attacks (Emergency Motion)

NS suggests that the motion should go to the Liberation and Diversity Forum.

It was suggested that the motion should go to the Welfare Forum.

Vote undertaken for whether the motion should go to the Liberation and Diversity Forum.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 10 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

GL announces that the motion is passed to go to the Liberation and Diversity Forum.

Vote undertaken for whether the motion should go to the Welfare Forum.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 20 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

6.13 Warwick against genocide in Gaza (Emergency Motion)

BS says that the SU should recognise and condemn the genocide taking place in Gaza and support pro-Palestine activists on campus. BS suggests that the motion should go to the Liberation and Diversity Forum.

Vote undertaken for whether the motion should go to the Liberation and Diversity Forum.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 20 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

6.14 Warwick SU supports a trans-inclusive ban on conversion therapy (Emergency Motion)

DV says that it is important for the Warwick SU to show solidarity with LGBTQ+ students offering them support and through expressing disapproval of conversion therapy and its harmful effects.

DJGC agrees with DV and recommends that the motion goes to the Liberation and Diversity Forum.

Vote undertaken for whether the motion should go to the Liberation and Diversity Forum.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 20 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

6.15 ASV Motion (Emergency Motion)

YY notes that once the motion has an official name, the name of this motion will be passed on to the forum that it is sent to.

EN says that the motion relates to welfare issues of racism, and so it should be sent to the Welfare and Liberation and Diversity Forums.

A point was made that the motion's vaque beliefs about spreading awareness of racism is already covered in the motion about Gaza, and so it might be redundant.

SC says there is no point in this motion going to ASV if the actions that the motion proposals are already being acted upon through plans to have days of commemoration relating to injustice and inequality.

A point was made that the motion is about racism overall, however it only talks about Holocaust Memorial Day, which would be specific to Jewish students. The motion should encompass the effects of racism on all groups.

Matt says that the first point on the motion says that "racism is once again becoming a prominent issue", but it has always been an issue.

Vote undertaken for whether the motion should go to the Liberation and Diversity Forum.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 20 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

Vote undertaken for whether the motion should go to the Welfare Forum.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 20 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

OC raises a point about the motion Warwick against genocide in Gaza (Emergency Motion), asking whether it would be able to go back to voting on it to make it go to the Welfare Forum.

GL says that since the discussion of this motion has already passed, they cannot go back on it and vote again.

7. Policy Review

YY says there are a large backdate of policies that need to be taken. The intention was for the Chair's action to take the policies to forum to be decided on and ratified by term 2. However, since GL is a temporary Chair, she doesn't have this ability.

YY informs GL of what the policies are and how Student Voice decides which forums they will be sent to.

EN strongly recommends pushing this to the next Council to let the forums go through this for a few weeks/months.

Vote undertaken for whether the motions should go to the forums to be ratified at the next Council.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 19 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

8. By-law Changes

YY says that there is a lot of back and forth that they have yet to receive consultation from. The full time and part time officer team, as well as a few forum rep members, convene as part of the by-law action group in order to have consultation for term 2. The compulsory attendees would be the FTOs, PTOs, but faculty reps and Forum rep members can also attend if they want.

JV suggest forum reps to prevent this body becoming filled very quickly and to streamline this process so that the by-laws can be put in place.

AT suggests an alternative that once a planned draft for the relevant by-laws is written up, they are directed to the relevant forum for final consultation.

SC says if there is one rep, everyone from the forum can input into that rep. Splitting up the by-laws and giving it to them will take a lot of time won't give insights into all parts of the by-laws. SC clarifies that she is arguing in favour of one person for each committee.

Vote undertaken for JV's amendment for FTOs, PTOs, and one person from each forum to decide the by-law changes.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 19 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

9. AOB

OO says that for most of the Council, TC was not acting as Chair and the objection about the conflict of interest and his position as Chair will continue to stand.

OO says that considerable council time will be wasted in a continuing cycle of votes of no confidence, and so time would be saved if TC were to resign now to prevent the Council from having to repeat this process.

OO suggests that there should be the vote of no confidence in TC.

GL says that as TC is no longer present in the meeting and so it cannot be voted on as a proper point of order.

A point was made that the accessibility of the meetings should be reviewed as a few disabled members have complained about this.

VR says that there are currently no elected postgraduate specific roles within Council. Previously there was a motion passed stating that there would be postgraduate representation at Council.

VR suggests that a system should be implemented in the PG assembly to better represent themselves at Council.

Vote undertaken.

UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED 17 IN FAVOUR / 0 AGAINST / 0 ABSENTIONS

MP says that as an ex-SU staff member that pay is bad for the workload expected, and the SU cannot claim to pay the living wage. The ASV motion from 2 years ago hasn't been acted upon.

GL offers for Student Voice to explain why this hasn't been implemented.

YY says that the motions went to ASV and whatever happened got referred to trustees and they explained the decision behind it. YY says that if MP wants to raise it, then it can be noted on Council.

AT says that it has been in discussion for a long time, but every financial decision made concerning the SU needs to take into consideration that there is an obligation to keep to SU financially stable.

JV asks that if Council feels that the conflict of interest isn't gone due to TC not resigning from either position, would the vote of no confidence have to take place again.

YY says that the vote would have the happen again, using procedural motions, but it can be escalated further.

GL says a reminder that motions to ASV for term 2 must be submitted on the 10th.
