

Regulation 2 – By-Elections and Cooptions

By-Elections

- 1. By-Elections are held to fill positions that have become vacant between the original election and the end of the term of office of that position.
- 2. By-Elections are automatically held for any position where Re-Open nominations is the winning candidate.
- 3. The timings of By-Elections are at the discretion of the Democracy and Development Officer (or the President if the position of Democracy and Development Officer is vacant).
- 4. The timings will be accepted provided that:
 - a) Nominations are open for at least a week
 - b) Campaigning and polling take place for the same length of time as they would for an ordinary election
 - c) Campaigning and polling takes place within the undergraduate term
 - d) the deadline for objections is no sooner than 12noon three working days after the release of the provisional results
- 5. With the exception of timings, the election will run following the same regulations as a normal election.

Co-Options

- 1. Co-options can be held for the positions of:
 - a) Faculty Representatives
 - b) Environment and Ethics Officer
 - c) Student Exec Members
- 2. Co-options are held to fill positions that:
 - a) become vacant between the original election and the end of the term of office of that position
 - b) have not been elected due to a lack of candidates or because the vote did not achieve quorum
- 3. The Democracy and Development Officer is responsible for the organisation and publicity of the Co-Options, supported by SU staff
- 4. Co-options will be voted on by Student Council
- 5. The conduct and timings will be accepted provided that:

- a) nominations are open seven days before the relevant Student Council Meeting
- b) nominations must be received before the start of the relevant Student Council Meeting Co-option process for that position.
- c) the Returning Officer and/or the Chair are present at the relevant Student Council Meeting
- d) all candidates are given the opportunity to submit or present a brief statement in support of their candidacy
- e) the deadline for objections is no sooner than 12noon three working days after the release of the results.
